FAQ for Exchange Students in Social Work (B.A.)

? Will all units be offered every semester?

! Yes, all units listed here will be offered every semester (winter *and* summer term) in German. See next question for English courses.

? What is the language of instruction?

! While all units listed here will be offered in German, approx. 10-15 units will also be offered in English or Spanish (called "International Curriculum"). They will be published in the course catalogue "LSF" online at www.ash-berlin.eu/lsf about 3-4 weeks before the start of the semester. In order to get an idea of what may be offered and in order to prepare your Learning Agreement, you should access the International Curriculum from past semesters at www.ash-berlin.eu/en/ash-international/exchange-at-ash-berlin/studying-at-ash-berlin/#c7405. Please note that they might be subject to change every semester.

? Do I have to do the entire module or can I attend single units?

! Yes, you can attend single units. If there are restrictions, we explain them in the field "Requirements" (e.g. in the module "Psychology" or "Social Work Theories and Methods").

? Can I attend units from different semesters (e.g. from the 1st, 3rd and 4th semester)?

! Yes, you can attend units from different semesters. If there are any structural or academic restrictions, we explain them in the field "Requirements".

? In some modules, the restrictions say that students must have completed at least 60 ECTS in social work or a related study area. What are related study areas?

! Related study areas are for example social pedagogics, sociocultural animation, psychology, education, sociology or political studies.

? In some modules and units, I can seem to choose if I want to do an exam or not – what does that mean?

! All units marked with the footnote* offer students the option to choose if they want to do the course with a final exam or not. The no. of ECTS you can receive for such a course depends on whether or not you do the exam. However, please be aware that some of our partner universities may only accredit courses if they are graded (i.e. if you have completed an exam). Please consult your home university to find out before you prepare your Learning Agreement.

? What kinds of exams will be offered?

! At least two of the listed kinds of exam will be offered from which you can choose. Your lecturers will inform you at the beginning of the semester about your exact exam options.

? In some modules, the exam is only pass or fail – what does that mean?

! In the elective module or in the module "Culture – Aesthetics – Media of Social Work", the exam is not graded, the grade is only pass or fail. Before preparing your Learning Agreement, please check with your home university, if they accept courses / modules that are not graded with a numerical grade, but only with pass or fail. If not, you may ask the ASH Berlin teachers for an exception and to grade your exam with a numerical grade.

? Where can I find the exact content of the modules and units?

? When and how will I know about the exact course times, locations and teachers? How can I sign up for the courses?

! You can access the course times and details via the course catalogue „LSF“ at www.ash-berlin.eu/lsf about 3-4 weeks before the start of the semester. During orientation, we will inform you in detail about how to use the LSF and how to register for your courses.

? Can I change my Learning Agreement after the semester has started?

! In certain circumstances, you can change your Learning Agreement after the semester has started, e.g. because of a time clash or in case a course isn't offered anymore and you need to substitute it with another course.

Information concerning modules and units:

Our Bachelor “Social Work” at ASH Berlin consists of so-called “modules”. A module is a complete “package” of teaching and learning with clearly defined contents to be completed in a set time-frame. Often, a module consists of several units (which may in turn consist of several parts). For example, our module “Diversity Studies” in the third semester consists of two units: unit 1 “Racism and Migration” and unit 2 “Gender and Queer Studies”.

As we explain in the FAQ / question 3 above, you usually do not have to complete the entire module, but you can also only attend single units. If there are restrictions, we explain them in the footnotes (e.g. in “Psychology” or “Social Work Theories and Methods”).

Please note: In case you complete the entire module, the ECTS and exam regulations mentioned in the grey module line apply. If you
